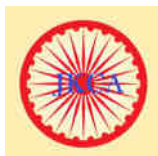

## From the desk of Secretary General

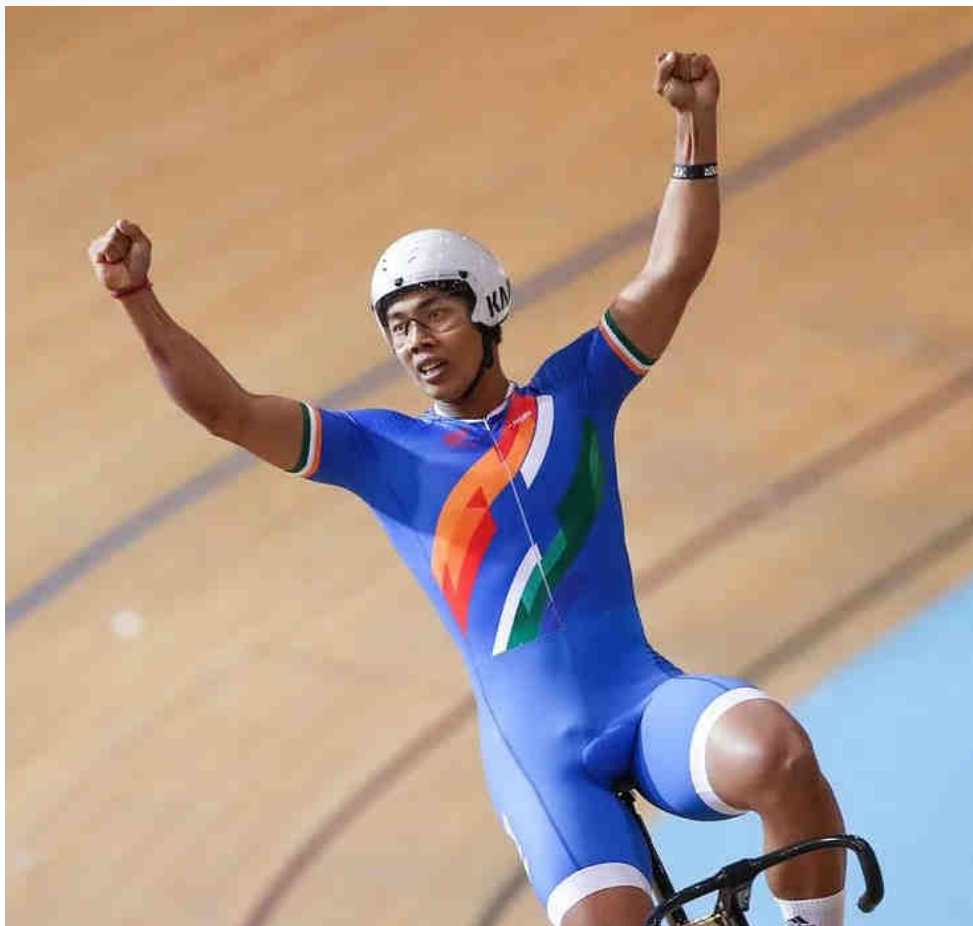

24th Senior, Junior & Sub-Junior National Road Cycling Championship was organised by Railway Sports Promotion Board in association with Cycling Federation of India at Bikaner, Rajasthan from 13th Nov to 16th Nov 2019. Around two odd Riders & Team Officials in Senior, Junior & Sub Junior boys & girls category from 27 States/ Department Participated in the championship under the guidance of 20 Technical Official nominated by Cycling Federation of India, Mr. Dharmendra Lamba was designated the Chief Commissaire for the said championships.












The Championships saw record participation and some fierce competition among the top cyclists of the Country. The championship was attended by a number of dignitaries from both the Indian Railways and Cycling Federation of India.

Even with the weather not favouring the cyclists, it did not deter them from performing to their absolute best. The support from local event organiser and determination of the Commissaires resulted in the event to become one of the most successful Road National Championships.

16th Senior, Junior & Sub Junior National Mountain Bike Championship was organised by Cycling Association of Uttarakhand under the aegis of Cycling Federation of India from 20th to 22nd Feb. 2020 at Balaut Resort, Haldwani, Uttarakhand for Senior (Men & Women), Junior & Sub Junior (Boys & Girls) category. Total number of 334 participants & Team officials from 25 States & Departments took part in the above mentioned championships. Mr. K. Dattatraya was appointed the Chief Commissaire for the said championships.

This was the first time ever, where the Downhill event was officially introduced in the National Championships. This was the first time the State of Uttarakhand was hosting a National Championships. Sh. Vimal Choudhary, President, Cycling Association of Uttarakhand and Vice President, Cycling Federation of India and his team were lauded for excellent arrangements. # Track Asia Cup, International Cycling event New Delhi, From 9th-11th Sep. 2019





Track Asia Cup 2019, International cycling event was organized by Cycling Federation of India at Indoor Cycling velodrome, IG Sports Complex, New Delhi from 9th to 11th Sep. 2019 with the support by Sports Authority of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India. The main sponsors were ONGC, Oil India and IFFCO TOKIO. The event was accredited as Class 1 UCI event. More than 150 cyclists/ team officials from 15 countries participated in the event with great enthusiasm and exhibited their best potential during the event. Mr. Wang Chi Yu from Hong Kong was appointed as Chief Commissaire for the said event by the International Cycling Union (UCI). 35 qualified officials from Cycling Federation of India and 20 local officials supported the Chief Commissaire during the conduct of event in a befitting manner. 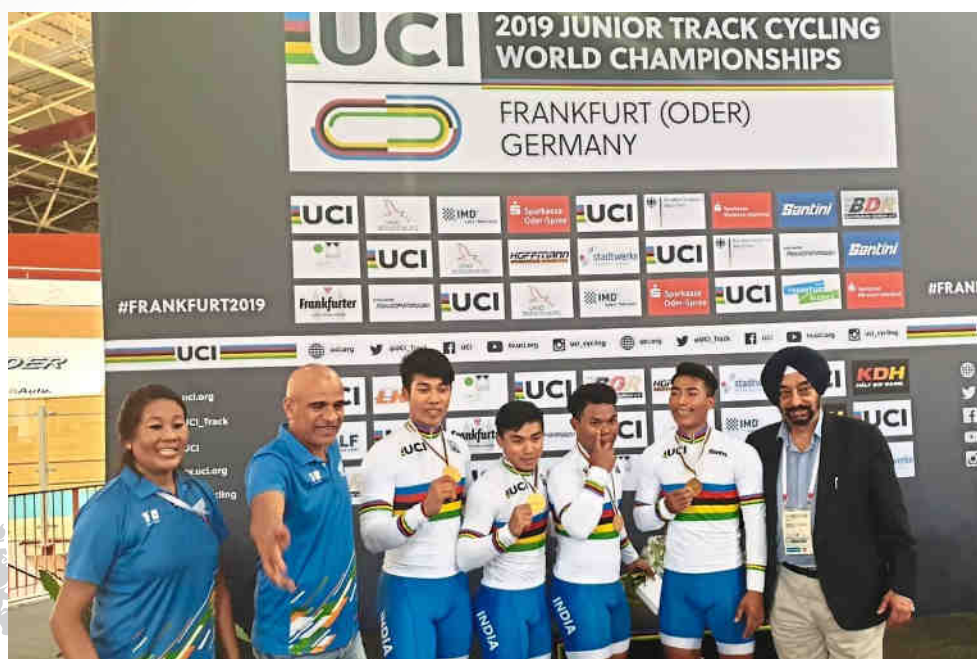


# UCI Junior World Track Cycling Championship Frankfurt, Germany

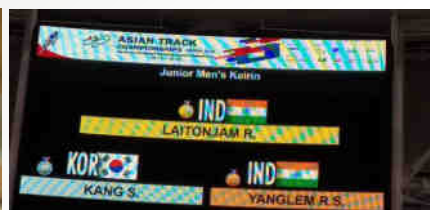

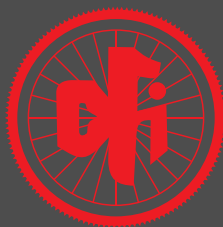
